2016 Bulky Waste Collection Information

Saturday Collection Dates: April 16th and October 22nd

Curbside Bulk Waste: All items must be curbside by 7:00 AM, on the day of collection. Acceptable items include, but are not limited to the following: *Mattresses, Bureaus, Couches, Chairs, Desks, and Large Children's Toys*

Construction Debris: No "piles" of construction debris will be collected. Not to exceed 50-pound bundles or barrels. Not to exceed five feet in length. Carpets (*rolled, folded & tied, not to exceed 50 lbs.*)

You can schedule delivery of a roll-off container to remove large or small quantities of Construction & Demolition Debris and other Bulky Waste Items (non-metal) from your home or business that exceed the curbside limit of 50 lbs.

As of 2008, the State of New Hampshire prohibits the disposal of certain hazardous materials at landfills, incinerators and transfer stations. The following items will not be collected as part of your regular weekly service: *TV's, Electronics, Monitors, Fluorescent Bulbs, Tubes, Thermometers, Thermostats, Batteries, Any Items Containing Mercury, and Lead*

Please call Casella at **888-903-7240** to schedule an appointment to properly remove these items.

Appliances: Fees and appointment **REQUIRED**. Not limited to the following items: **\$25.00:** *Washer, Dryer, Dish Washer, Hot Water Heater, Stove Furnace (non-brick), Dehumidifier*

\$50.00: *Monitor, TV, Refrigerator, Freezer, Air Conditioner*

TV's and electronics may be collected in accordance with the bulk item regulations listed above.

Mercury-containing lamp tubes and bulbs, and several other electronic waste items can be safely recycled. Please call **888-903-7240** for more information.

Homeowners should check with municipal offices for acceptance of these items at local solid waste facilities or household hazardous waste (HHW) collection days.


CURBSIDE CONTAINER PLACEMENT GUIDE

Help us to provide you with the best possible service! This guide illustrates the proper and improper placement of your curbside containers and offers tips to help with the curbside collection of materials.



CONTAINER DO'S

- Keep containers on a hard, level surface clear of snow and other landscaping debris and no more than 6' from edge of curb.
- Please allow containers a 3' perimeter of clearance from obstructions such as parked cars, trees, mailboxes and utility poles. There must also be a 15' over head clearance from any low hanging tree branches or power lines, etc.
- If you have more than one cart placed at the curb, please set them side by side as indicated in the illustration with at least 3' of clearance between the containers.
- Please call **800-CASELLA** to schedule an extra item pickup if you have extra large or additional materials that do not fit inside your curbside containers.




CONTAINER DONT'S



- Containers must remain upright for pickup
- Keep all materials inside the container
- Do not place containers back to back
- Keep container clear of all obstructions

CARDBOARD HANDLING

Please breakdown all cardboard so it fits into the cart with the lid closed. Cut oversized material into 2' x 2' squares.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Zero-Sort® Recycling?

Zero-Sort Recycling is Casella's state-of-the-art process which enables paper, cardboard, plastic, glass, and metal to be collected together in one bin eliminating the need for you to separate recyclables.

Can I throw trash and recyclables into my Zero-Sort Recycling bin?

NO. Your Zero-Sort Recycling bin is for Zero-Sort recyclables only. Items that can't be recycled should be tossed into your trash bin.

Can I put grocery bags into my Zero-Sort bin or place recyclables in plastic bags?

NO. Plastic bags of any kind are not accepted in Zero-Sort Recycling. To recycle grocery bags, please bring them to a participating grocery or retail store.

How should I prepare my recyclables?

Recyclables should be rinsed clean of any food waste. Corrugated cardboard boxes should be broken down into 2' max pieces. Lids and caps can remain on empty plastic bottles. **DO NOT** tie newspaper or cardboard with twine.

What type of metal can I recycle?

Aluminum and tin cans are acceptable. Pots, pans, and scrap metal such as automotive parts, motors, and appliances are **NOT ALLOWED**.

What are large rigid plastics?

Items made of plastic which include, sleds, soda crates, laundry baskets, 5-gallon pails, plastic chairs, carts, toys, garbage cans, and general household items.

Plastic bags or wrapping, window glass, mirrors, light bulbs, dishes, pyrex or other heat treated glass, ceramics, paper towel, facial tissue, styrofoam, recyclables containing food waste, paints, oils, hazardous material, needles, syringes, VCR tapes, CDs/DVDs, scrap metal, pots, pans, batteries, hard-cover books, clothing/textiles, wood/lumber, yard trimmings, 3-ring/spiral notebooks




