Review Minutes: Previous minutes reviewed and approved

Old Business:

Charlie Zilch - Long Pond/111A property

- 1. Charlie Zilch Plan review for proposed lot on the corner of Long Pond / 111A, third view.
- 2. Charlie reviewed and brought Chip up to speed on the plans, setbacks, wetlands etc.
- 3. Charlie advised that Mr Kent did not want to reduce the bedrooms from 3 to 2 for concerns of the
- 4. home being marketable for sale. Charlie suggested that they would be using a Clean solution
- 5. septic system in order to support the 3 bedroom option, this system was discussed with the
- 6. board.
- 7. Charlie informed the board that he attempted to gain undercover vehicle storage by reworking 8. the plan in several ways, but was unable to accomplish this. Charlie did recommend putting a
- 9. substantial size shed on the property for storage, this could be accomplished with the current
- 10. plan.
- 11. Carsten suggested that he believes that the property could still be a 2 bedroom and not a
- 12. 3 bedroom. A 75 foot setback. Carsten discussed the vehicle coverage and stated that there should be something to
- 13. cover vehicles. Charlie recommended moving the angle of the home in order to accomplish the
- 14. drive under garage.
- 15. Carsten stated that there were a lot of good changes made by Charlie and that they were looking
- 16. at a 2 story structure with a garage, the board agreed that the plan needed additional
- 17. revisions, and a new test pit would need to be done. Conservation would schedule Charlie as
- 18. soon as possible once the plans were revised in order to proceed to ZBA.
- 19. It was agreed if they went with a covered garage, they could eliminate the shed on the
- 20. property.
- 21. The board voted in favor for the encumbrance of funds in the amount of 1,271.38, per the invoice for supplies from East Coast Lumber, for the purpose of completing the shed on the conservation land. *Invoice estimate provided.

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New Business:

Bobby Loree - Long Pond Protective Assoc.

- 23. Discussion of Long pond/dam, Bob Griffin attended the last meeting and gave the group some history
- 24. about the dam. Bob mentioned that he received some information from the dam bureau and that he
- 25. had done some minor repairs to the dam, but he did not see any issues with the dam. Carsten stated
- 26. that the dam is in Kingston not Danville and he asked if there was any change in status of the grant
- 27. application of funds, Bobby stated not to his knowledge.
- 28. The lowering of the pond was discussed and that it was done, but that the rain has impacted the level
- 29. of the dam.

No other new business to come before the board.
