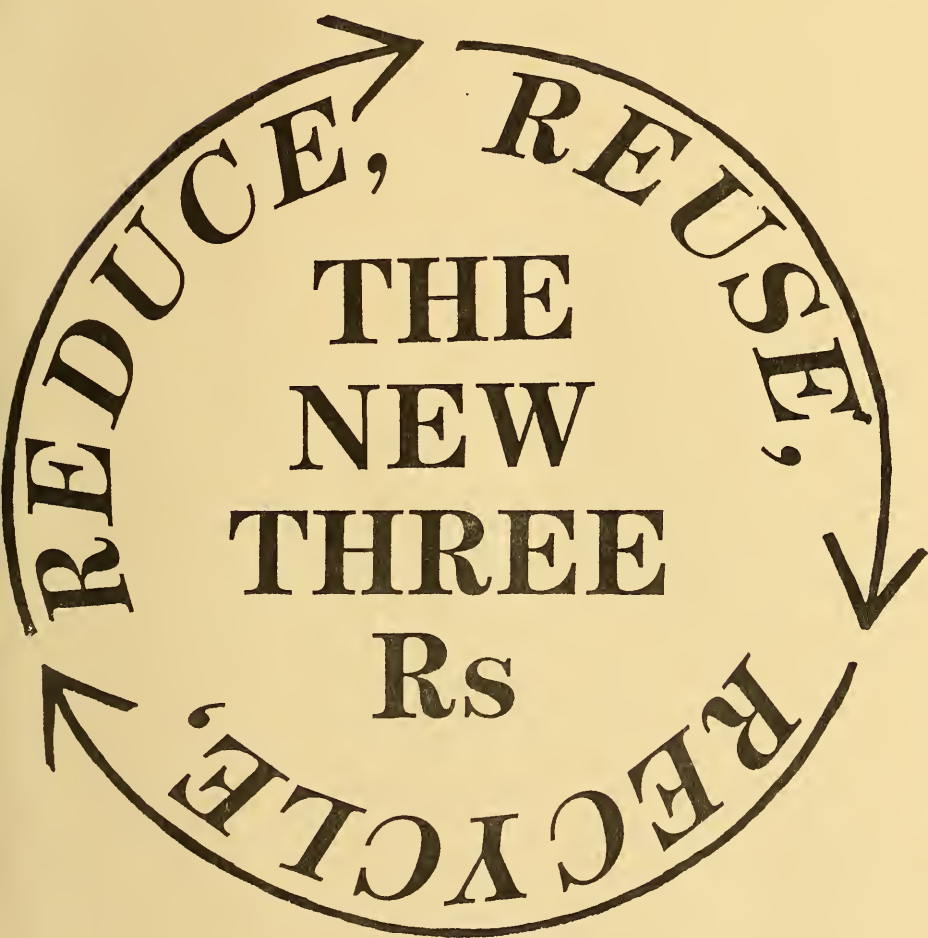

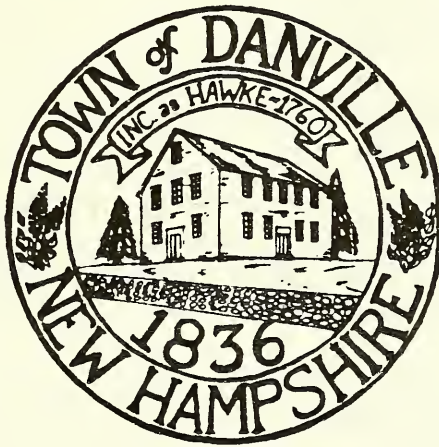

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## DEDICATION

Born on June 22, 1909, MELTON R. SANBORN has been active in Town Politics for close to 60 years---or should we use the phrase "nigh on to".....

Back in 1934, Melton became both Tax Collector and Road Agent. As best as can be determined, he was Tax Collector from 1934 to 1943, with maybe the exception of 1936; and was appointed as Tax Collector again for part of the year 1959.

As Road Agent, he served in 1934 and 1936 and 1937, and then again from 1948 to 1953.

Melton became Cemetery Sexton, member of the Cemetery Trustees, and "Caretaker of Parks" in 1968. Then in 1971 became Town Forester---serving in all four posts until 1982, when he dropped the Sexton of Cemetery and "Caretaker of Parks" positions. Since 1983, he has been Cemetery Trustee and Town Forester.

Melton was also Forest Fire Warden for the Town of Danville from 1951 until 1991. The Danville Board of Selectmen certainly thank him for his years of dedication to the Town in all of his various positions.

Any of you who have been in Town for more than a few years, have perhaps enjoyed Melton's short "terse" reports each year in the Town Report---many look forward to reading them each year.

We wish continued good health to Melton and Marcia and look forward to seeing his brief reports for many years to come.

# WARRANT and BUDGET-1992

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danville in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Danville Fire Association Hall in said Danville, on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. (By ballot)
2. To choose all necessary School District Officers for the ensuing year. (By ballot)
3. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendment to the existing Danville Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Danville Planning Board as follows:

Amend Article VII, General Provisions, Paragraph F., "Building Code" to read:

"The Building Officials and Code Administrators International (BOCA) Code, basic only, in effect January 1981 and as amended yearly shall be the minimum standards for all construction within the Town of Danville. Minimum construction standards for manufactured housing in the Town of Danville shall conform to United States Department of Housing and Urban Development Regulation Part 3280 - Manufactured Home Construction and Safety Standards (latest edition)." (By ballot)

4. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendment to the existing Danville Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Danville Planning Board as follows:

Add to Article II, Definitions, a new Paragraph P., to read:

## P. PRESITE BUILT HOUSING

As used in these ordinances, "presite built housing" means any structure designed primarily for residential occupancy which is wholly or in substantial part made, fabricated, formed or assembled in off-site manufacturing facilities in conformance with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development minimum property standards and local building codes, for installation, or assembly and installation, on the building site. For the purposes of these ordinances, "presite built housing" shall not include manufactured housing." (By ballot)

5. To see if the Town will vote to ratify the action of the Selectmen in turning over the Parsonage Funds to the Trustees of Trust Funds; and to see how much of these funds the Town will vote to spend for the ensuing year.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax title property by public auction.

8. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to reconvey title to tax deeded property to the former owners only; and only upon repayment of taxes, costs, interest and other expenses incurred.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend without further action by the Town Meeting money from the State, Federal or another governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:95b.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept aid relative to natural disasters from the Federal Government Federal Disaster Assistance Administration in Washington.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to implement a 'user fee' trash collection and recycling program during 1992. The 'user fee' approach will remove the cost of trash collection and recycling from the property tax rate. The 'user fee' is to be collected through the sale of specially-marked trash bags for curbside collection of trash, and per-item fees for the drop-off of bulky items at designated times.

12. To see if the Town will adopt the following bylaw, pursuant to the authority granted to RSA 31:39:

"It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to dump, deposit, throw or leave, or to cause or permit the dumping, depositing, placing, throwing or leaving of litter on any public or private property in the Town of Danville, or in or on ice or in any waters in the Town of Danville, unless:

I. Such property is designated by the Town of Danville or by the State of New Hampshire (or by any of its agencies or political subdivisions) for the disposal of such litter, and such person is authorized by the proper public authority to use such property;

II. Such litter is placed into a litter receptacle or container installed on such property;

III. Such person is the owner or tenant in lawful possession of such property, or has first obtained consent of the owner or tenant in lawful possession, or unless the act is done under the personal direction of said owner or tenant, all in a manner consistent with the public welfare.

For the purposes of this bylaw, 'litter' means all rubbish, refuse, garbage, trash, debris, dead animals or other discarded materials of every kind and description.

The Maximum penalty for each offense shall be one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). Any amounts received by the Town under this bylaw shall be applied by the Selectmen (who are hereby authorized to expend the funds) to costs of prevention, detection and cleanup of illegal littering."



13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, pursuant to the powers granted by RSA 149-M, to regulate or restrict private haulers of solid waste so as to ensure that the Town can collect sufficient revenue under a 'user fee' solid waste program to pay contract costs and obligations incurred by the Town in the operation of the program.
14. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw \$95,000. (Ninety Five Thousand Dollars) from the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund, and raise and appropriate \$35,000. (Thirty Five Thousand Dollars) for a total of \$130,000. (One Hundred and Thirty Thousand Dollars) to purchase a new fire truck.
15. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen/Fire Wards to sell the 1972 International Fire Truck (E2) VIN# 106820H293 and the Dodge Rescue (R5) VIN#2261281554, and the proceeds of the sale be placed in the existing Capital Reserve Fund for Future Fire Truck Purchases.
16. To see if the Town will vote to accept Sweet Street, Danielle Street, Justin Drive, Beechwood Drive, Cobbler's Ridge, and Candy Lane as Town Roads, conditioned upon certification of the completion of the construction by the Town Engineer/Town Road Agent by August 30, 1992, and acceptance by the Selectmen.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. (Five Thousand Dollars) to be placed in the Colby Memorial Library Capital Reserve Fund. (Not recommended by Budget Committee)
18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$8,500. (Eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars) to be added to the existing Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund.
19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600. (One Thousand Six Hundred Dollars) to purchase a PC type computer system for the use of the Police Department.
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25,000. (Twenty Five Thousand Dollars) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for Future Fire Truck Purchases. (Not recommended by Budget Committee)
21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$18,900. (Eighteen Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars) to purchase new open-circuit self contained breathing apparatus per NFPA 1981 for the Fire Department. (Not recommended by Budget Committee)
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,900. (Eleven Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars) to repair and update the Fire Department SCBA equipment to meet the NFPA standard 1981. (Not recommended by Budget Comm.)
23. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw up to \$1,000. (One Thousand Dollars) from the Recreation Capital Reserve Fund for maintenance to Town Field (Known as Kenneth R. Day Memorial Field). (By petition)

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000. (Ten Thousand Dollars) for the purchase of the computer package for the Tax Collector/Selectmen/and Town Treasurer.

25. To see if the Town of Danville will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400. (Four Hundred Dollars) to assist Seacoast Hospice a non-profit organization. (By petition)

26. To see if the Town will vote to open Old Johnson Road from the existing point of closure to Huntington Hill Extension; to open Huntington Hill Extension from Old Johnson Road to the constructed turn-around (approximately 1,000 feet toward Route 111); and to open Back Road from end of existing pavement to Cross Road--all contingent upon certification of upgrading to Class V. status by August 30, 1992.

27. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

28. To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.

The polls will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

The second session of the Business Meeting will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 14, 1992, at the Fire Association Hall.

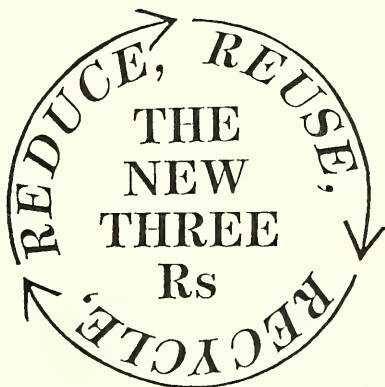
The Town Clerk shows an underpayment of \$1.00 to the Treasurer and a discrepancy of the amount of town tax to be collected in the auto registration account.

## 1991 PLANNING BOARD TOWN REPORT

The continued sluggishness of the New England economy has slowed the Planning Board's business down to a crawl. While there were twenty-six new lots created in Danville in 1991, twenty-one came from a single subdivision. The remaining five were single lot subdivisions. Five previously conditionally approved subdivision permits were renewed.

All Planning Board recommended articles passed at the 1991 Town Meeting, the most significant of which was the enactment of the Floodplain Development Ordinance which allows Danville to become a member of the National Flood Insurance Program.

This year proposals for zoning changes/additions are minor in scope. The first change removes some overly restrictive wording from our basic building code ordinance and adds a statement governing minimum acceptable construction standards for manufactured housing. The basic BOCA code will be used for general construction requirements while HUD Regulation No. 3280, "Manufactured Home Construction and Safety Standards" will be used for Manufactured Housing/Mobile Homes. The second article is a new definition describing a presite-built house. This should clarify differences between what is meant by modular housing (presite-built housing) and manufactured housing (mobile home).

The most significant event of 1991 for New Hampshire towns Planning Boards is the Chester, N.H. court case. The courts have ruled Chester's zoning be to overly restrictive with little or no opportunity for "affordable" housing. We have had Danville's zoning reviewed by the Rockingham Planning Commission and they report that our zoning provides reasonable opportunities with a variety of different housing choices.

1992 will be a challenging year for the Planning Board. Several members have attended seminars on the new soil-type lot sizing ordinance put together by an ad hoc committee for the Rockingham Conservation District and the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services. This ordinance provides a solid scientific method for determining

minimum lot sizes rather than the arbitrary method used by most towns now. The Planning Board will undertake a complete review of our zoning so as to incorporate this ordinance into our regulations. We hope to present the result to the Town for the 1993 Town Meeting.

This department welcomes any donation of animal food, clean blankets, shoe boxes or any animal supplies that you may want to donate.

Medical calls are again the largest area of requests for assistance. To better meet these emergencies, the Rescue Squad is continually training to higher levels. The Fire Association and Firebells are supporting this by assisting with the purchase of new equipment and supplies for both the Fire and Rescue efforts.

C. P. R. classes will be continued again this year for the public, please contact Jan Pouliot if you are interested in a course.

As was stated last year the "Tire Pile" has been "CHIPPED" and now has been "Transported" to "chipped rubber users".

The Dept. is again asking your support to purchase a much needed piece of apparatus. We now have approximately \$100,000. in the capital reserve fund and will need to raise approximately \$35,000. at this time. It is our intention to replace two pieces of equipment with this new better designed and equipped vehicle which will be a combination Pumper/Attack/Heavy Rescue.

TOTAL CALLS FOR SERVICE 1079



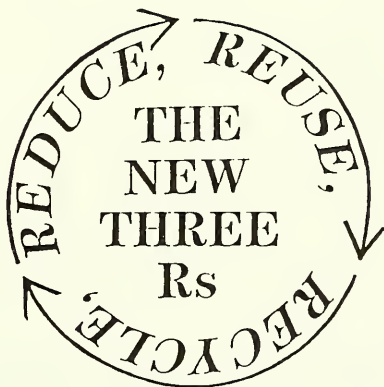

## COLBY MEMORIAL LIBRARY

This has been a very busy year at the library, particularly with a 22% increase again this year of patrons visiting the library. The biggest increase has been in the numbers of patrons who come in on Saturday mornings. This has been an overwhelming problem for the volunteers, so the Trustees are proposing to have the staff on hand on Saturdays and use the volunteers in other ways.

Dottie held another successful Summer Reading Program with over 75 participants who with their families attended a party at the end of the summer at which they received their certificates. She has been having Thursday afternoon Story Hours for 4- and 5-year olds.

The Friends of the Library, a small but dedicated group, have continued to hold their Christmas Crafts Sale, an Easter Bake Sale and sold items such as cards, pens and cutlery at the checkout desk. They bought large-print books and videos with this income. They also put some money into their Fund for the Library addition.

The Library is free to all residents and is presently open on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 3-8:30 p.m. and Wednesday and Saturday from 9 a.m. to Noon.
