HIGHWAY DEPT.

Winter is coming!

• Do not push snow into the road.

This creates a slippery, hazardous, frozen rut. Any household doing this will be fined \$100.00 for the first offense and \$200.00 for each subsequent offense.

• Do not leave basketball hoops, trash totes, and other equipment in the right-of-way.

The plow drivers are not responsible for damage to your property in the town's right-of-way.

A parking regulation prohibits parking vehicles on the streets during any winter storm (ice or snow) and for 48 hours after the storm has passed. Violation of this regulation will incur a fine of \$50.00 for each occurrence.

• Blue trash bags are available in the town hall for you to use to clean up the roadsides. Once you fill the bag, leave it on the roadside, and call 382-0703 for it to be picked up. Thank you all for your help in keeping Danville clean! Earth Day 2019 is April 22.

• Pick up your dog waste.

Just like human sewage, untreated pet fecal matter is harmful to your water. Rain washes giardia and salmonella and other disease-causing organisms into the ground water, that may make your water unsafe to drink.

TRASH/RECYCLE BULK SERVICES

The cost of trash/recycling disposal has increased. Curb-side bulk collection is a premium service that has come at a premium price. The Selectmen and Casella have been working on ways to keep costs and the administration of the service reasonable.

Q. Why did bulk services change?

A. Casella has worked with the Selectmen for a long time to resolve problems with this premium service. The forms have helped resolve many issues.

Q. Why is there a size restriction?

A. Bulky waste pick-up is meant for items that would not fit in your toter during weekly pick-up or in a car and taken to another facility, such as the Raymond Transfer Station.

Q. What if I don't have a pick-up truck?

A. That is not a condition exclusive to Danville. If you can get items into the back seat or trunk of your car, you can take them to a disposal facility.
