BULK PICK-UP

This service is for Danville residents only.

•You must register your address with the town via email, mail, or in person prior for each bulk pick-up date. If your address is not on the list, your items will not be collected.

•Items should be placed curbside no more than one week prior to the pick-up date.

- Place tarps over upholstered items to keep out the rain/snow.
- Your taxes pay per ton and rain/snow adds unnecessary weight.

An item or bundle should not weigh more than 50 pounds.

•Next bulk pick-up is Oct. 20.



Q. Why is there a form?

A. To help explain the DOs and DON'Ts of the premium service and to improve efficiency for Casella. This allows them to plan their route which saves their time and your tax dollars.

Q. Why is there a size restriction?

A. Bulky waste pick-up is meant for items that would not fit in your toter during weekly pick-up or in a car and taken to another facility, such as the Raymond Transfer Station.

Q. What if I don't have a pick-up truck to take big items somewhere else?

A. That is not a condition exclusive to Danville. If you can get items into the back seat or trunk of your car, you can take them to a disposal facility.

Q. Why did we change our bulk services?

A. Casella has been in consultation with our Selectmen for several years about problems with our curbside bulk

service. Many solutions were discussed. Requiring pre-registration through a form was the easiest way to bring efficiency and control to an expensive service that has been abused by others.

Q. Why is there a fee for some items?

A. Some items require special handling during disposal.

Q. I don't want to wait for the next bulk day. What can I do?

A. Casella will pick up white goods any time of year. You can also use the Raymond Transfer Station any time. The disposal fees are lower than our curbside service. Casella will also discount the cost of a roll-off container for your use. This is especially helpful for home renovations or if you are moving.

Don't have a truck or ability to move big items?

•Contact a neighbor, local furniture store, a moving company, near-by church or scout organization, or ask for students at the high school who need service hours to augment their college applications.

On Prescott Road in Raymond---

3.3 miles from Route 111A and Route 107 intersection;

1.4 miles from Route 101; .5 mile from Paradise Drive.
