Exceptions are declared in Section XIII.B.9."

Article 2024-17 Modification of Elderly Exemption

To see if the Town of Danville will vote to modify the provisions of RSA 72:39-a for elderly exemption from property tax, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers, to be the following: for a person 85 years of age up to 74 years, Ninety Six Thousand Dollars (\$96,000.00); for a person 75 years of age up to 79 years, One-Hundred Thirty Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$137,500.00); for a person 80 years of age or older, One Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$169,000.00). To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least three consecutive years, the person may own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married for at least five years and the property must be the primary residence. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) or, if married, a combined net income of less than Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00); and own net assets not in excess of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) excluding the value of the person's residence. This article shall take effect for 2024 property tax year.
