To see if the Town of Danville will vote to modify the elderly exemption from property tax in the Town of Danville, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers, to be the following: for a person 65 years of age up to 74 years, Ninety Six Thousand Dollars and no cents (\$96,000.00); for a person 75 years of age up to 79 years, One-Hundred Thirty Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and no cents (\$137,500.00); for a person 80 years of age or older, One Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Dollars and no cents (\$169,000.00). To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least three consecutive years, the person may own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years and the property must be the primary residence. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars and no cent (\$37,000.00) or, if married, a combined net income of less than Forty-Six Thousand Two Hundred Dollars and no cents (\$46,200.00); and own net assets not in excess of Eighty-One Thousand Dollars and no cents (\$81,000.00) excluding the value of the person's residence." This article shall take effect for 2022 property tax year.
